THE CONSTITUTION OF INDIA
PART IVA - Fundamental Duties

ARTICLE 51A

Fundamental Duties—It shall be the duty of every citizen of India—

- to abide by the Constitution and respect its ideals and institutions, the National Flag and the National Anthem;
- to cherish and follow the noble ideals which inspired our national struggle for freedom;
- to uphold and protect the sovereignty, unity and integrity of India;
- to defend the country and render national service when called upon to do so;
- to promote harmony and the spirit of common brotherhood amongst all the people of India transcending religious, linguistic and regional or sectional diversities; to renounce practices derogatory to the dignity of women;
- to value and preserve the rich heritage of our composite culture;
- to protect and improve the natural environment including forests, lakes, rivers, wild life and to have compassion for living creatures;
- to develop the scientific temper, humanism and the spirit of inquiry and reform;
- to safeguard public property and to adjust violence;
- to strive towards excellence in all spheres of individual and collective activity so that the National constantly rises to higher levels of endeavour and achievement;
- who is a parent or guardian to provide opportunities for education to his child or, as the case may be, ward between the age of six and fourteen years (Eighty-sixth Amendment).

Notes on Holidays:—(a) Sundays are holidays under the Negotiable Instruments Act. (b) In the Year 2017, the following festivals/occasions:— (i) New Year's Day (2017 A.D.) (1st January), (ii) Doljatra (12th March), (iii) Mahabir Jayanti (For Jains only) (Sectional Holiday) (April 9) (iv) Ekadashi of Durga Puja & Muharram (1st October) fall on Sundays, which are Public Holidays under N.I. Act and hence have not been included in the list of holidays. (c) No substitute holiday should be allowed if any of the festival/holidays initially notified subsequently happens to fall on a weekly off or any other non-working day or in the event of more than one festival falling on the same day. (d) If there is any change in the date of Id-Ul-Fitar, Id-Ud-Zoha, Muharram, Fateha-Dwaz-Daham, Sab-e-Barat, depending upon the sighting of the Moon, holiday will be declared by a separate order for the date on which the festival would be actually observed in lieu of the date originally notified as holiday for this festival. (e) It may happen that the change of date of the above occasions has to be notified at a very short notice. In such a situation, announcement would be made through TV/AIR/Newspapers and the Heads of Departments/Offices of the State Government may take action according to such an announcement without waiting for a formal order about the change of date. (f) The holidays declared with double asterisk marks i.e. [**] are applicable to those Government Offices only where Saturdays are not observed as full holiday. (g) The State Government Offices only where Saturdays are not observed as full holiday including Treasuries, Sub-Treasuries shall remain open on the 1st April 2017, which has been declared as Public Holiday under N. I. Act, under this Notification. (h) On the following days during the year 2017, which are not declared to be Public Holidays, the Offices under the Government of West Bengal, with the exception of the Offices of the Registrar of Assurances, Kolkata and Collector of the Stamp Revenue, Kolkata, shall be closed:—February 24—Shivaratri, March 13—Holi, July 13—Birthdays of Poet Bhanu Bhakt (for Darjeeling district only), August 14—Jannastami, September 26—Mahasasthi of Durga Puja, October 3 & 4—Additional Day in connection with Durga Puja, October 6—Additional Day for Lakshmi Puja, October 20—Additional Day in connection with Kali Puja, October 21—Bhadriddwitya, December 2—Fateha-Dwaz-Daham (i) The following days may be observed as Sectional Holidays in the year 2017 for the employees of different communities mentioned against each:—April 15—Easter Saturday (for Christians only) & Baisakhi (for Sikhs only), May 10—Buddha Purnima (for Buddhists only), May 12—Sab-e-Barat (for Muslims only), Karam Puja to be notified later on, October 26—Chhat Puja.
